Message from the Chair

Message from the President



Over the course of 2018-2019 FACTOR continues to make decisions to serve our clients in the ever-changing marketplace. We have put focus on program changes to meet the expanding needs, outreach to ensure everyone knows about the improved programs and opportunities available to them, and pushing to find new opportunities and projects in the future to showcase the amazing musical works of our client base.

In the growing global music economy, with the live sector and streaming services booming, export and touring have never been more important. This past year FACTOR has funded over 3,397 international dates for 466 artists – this includes 245 artists playing over 3,100 tour dates and 221 artists showcasing at just under 300 events all outside of Canada. Past juried recipients who are not yet Artist level 2 and 3 have also been able to access showcase and tour funding, which has garnered major support and appreciation from both the clients and partners at this stage in their budding careers.

Over this last year, FACTOR has made great strides to study demand and make smart program changes and to find new opportunities to serve our partners and clients better. In 2018-2019 over 80% of the touring, showcase and business travel programs applications were approved, and we'll be putting an additional \$1 million dollars into these programs in the coming year. Export


has been a key focus of the Department of Canadian Heritage and we continue to support fantastic programs on the global stage such as Reeperbahn in Germany, Printemps de Bourges in France, while developing new markets and genre opportunities with Linecheck in Milan, Italy later this year and the Frankfurt Book Fair in Germany in 2020.

Through new CRTC mandates, we have received substantial increased funding for expanded video and other music programs. By using new funds from that source and other radio CCD benefits, FACTOR has developed a new program for publishers and expanded the available funding for songwriters' workshops. To support the widest diversity possible in our programming, we are partnering with Musicaction to create more initiatives together in Canada and other territories.

Communication is key to FACTOR working with our artist community and we love hearing feedback from our clients and partners. Please do drop a line if you have any comments or suggestions to make FACTOR better! You can reach me at msymsyk@entonegroup.com.

This year, we partnered with Musicaction to support English artists at Printemps de Bourges, one of the most important festivals on the French calendar, and a place where European professionals from the Francophonie gather to hear and see new acts for festivals across France, Belgium and Switzerland. We expect to continue that collaboration as we see more opportunity for Canadian artists in traditional French markets.

In conjunction with our efforts to support Canada as the country of honour for the Frankfurt Book Fair 2020, we will again be working with Musicaction, who is the lead partner in assembling

the Canadian presence for our sector at jazzahead! in Bremen. In support of the Frankfurt Book Fair, we will be assembling events to promote Canadian talent at the Berlin Film Festival, Elbjazz, and in Hamburg and Munich. As well, we will be creating the definitive music show for the Book Fair itself. These events will be done with the support of the Canadian Embassy in Berlin, and the invaluable support of Sound Diplomacy in Germany.

In the upcoming months we will be working with Manitoba Music, developing and financing opportunities for Indigenous artists to showcase in Australia at Big Sound and in Germany with CIMA at the Reeperbahn Conference and Festival.

RECs are engaged in providing one-on-one consultation about FACTOR and its programs to local artists and music entrepreneurs, running local workshops and seminars, and in recruiting and training FACTOR jurors.

Government of Canada:

Through the Canada Music Fund of the Department of Canadian Heritage, FACTOR administered \$10,000,601.

Collective Initiatives

Collective Initiatives provides financial assistance for initiatives that develop, promote and showcase the broader Canadian music industry through awards shows, educational initiatives, international showcases, and tools for marketing Canadian music on digital platforms.

New Musical Works

New Musical Works provides a broad range of support to artists, record labels, artist managers, publishers, distributors and other organizations.

Broadcasters' Contributions: Canada's private radio broadcasters contributed

\$8,108,400 to FACTOR.

Through the Broadcasting Act, commercial radio licensees are required to support the creation and presentation of Canadian programming. Satellite radio and pay audio licensees are also required to provide support under their conditions of license.

Tangible (Transaction) Benefits


Over & Above Contributions are discretionary commitments made by applicants for new licenses that do not fall under the above contributions, which become conditions of license if the application is successful.



In contributions from Broadcasters.



Applications Approved by Genre







Our jurors include artists, producers, managers, agents, promoters, record label executives, publishers, publicists, programming and music directors, radio DJ's and more. Jurors come from all over Canada and abroad and use their expertise to help funding reach applicants in FACTOR's most popular programs. In 2018, conference attendees chose from over 60 different workshops, panel discussions, music showcases, and networking events over 5 days and were also invited to take part in 1-on-1 mentorship sessions and a free music tradeshow featuring world-class vendors like
- Roland, Universal Audio, Moog, and 20 more. Over 125 artists and speakers were featured at the event including A Tribe Called Red, Malcolm Cecil, Octave One, DJ Heather, and many more.

Stagehand

Digital Marketing

Stagehand is a web platform that connects musicians with venues to book and promote live events. Stagehand makes traditional music venues more efficient, and perhaps more importantly, it enables a new type of performance venue. Commercial venues like airports would like to host live music to improve their customer experience but historically lack of structure and process has made this too difficult. Stagehand provides the bridge that makes it easy for large commercial venues to work with the local grassroots music community.

Stagehand makes it easy for venues to:

- Find and decide on new artists based on standardized artist profiles
- Create clear online contracts as well as payments to artists
- Manage a list of partner artists who receive access to a private schedule
- Enable artists to schedule their own performances
- Collect & present valuable operational data for both venue and artist

Stagehand is a relatively new company but have already signed up over 1,000 artists and booked over 2,300 events. They are currently working with multiple Canadian airports, including the Calgary International Airport which is currently hosting 5 live performance per day, a number that will soon grow with the opening of a new stage in April.

Stagehand provides the bridge that makes it easy for large commercial venues to work with the local grassroots music community.



When I released my first Ralph song "Trouble", my manager and I divided up a list of 400 music blogs and individually emailed each music editor about the track. It took roughly two days and a lot of screen time, but we were excited about the project and determined to see the song get notice. Years later, I feel just as excited and driven except now the support has grown and we have others working with us who feel the same way. FACTOR has been such a huge part of this growth, providing JSR funding for my first EP *Ralph*. That funding allowed me to work with talented producers and sound engineers, it meant I could have six songs on my EP instead of two or three, and most of all, it meant I could put out a body of work that I was proud of. This initial funding at the start of my career helped build my success to what it is now, with 22 million streams on Spotify, a record deal, and two Canada wide tours supporting successful Canadian pop artists. It's an honour to be funded alongside amazing Canadian talent, I don't take it lightly and I'm so grateful that grant organizations like FACTOR exist.



The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose

of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Company's internal control.

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.

Notes to Financial Statements

March 31, 2019

1. General

Foundation Assisting Canadian Talent on Recordings (FACTOR or The capital asset fund records capital asset purchases and proceeds the Foundation) was incorporated as a not-for-profit organization of disposition and the related amortization of these assets. without share capital on June 17, 1982, under the Canada Corporations Act. During 2011, the board of directors authorized the creation of the

FACTOR provides funding by way of grants to Canadian individuals and groups in the music recording industry in order to promote and foster Canadian talent. FACTOR receives and disburses funds, pursuant to agreements with the Government of Canada, under the Department of Canadian Heritage's New Musical Works and Collective Initiatives programs. The current contract with the Government of Canada expires on March 31, 2020. Financial contributions received from Canada's private radio industry are likewise distributed by FACTOR to individuals and groups in the Canadian music industry.

Pursuant to the Income Tax Act (Canada), FACTOR is classified as a not-for-profit organization and therefore is not subject to income taxes.

2. Basis of presentation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNPO) issued by the Canadian Accounting Standards Board applied within the framework of the accounting policies summarized below.

3. Significant accounting policies

Fund accounting

FACTOR follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. The general fund accounts for the Foundation's general operating activities. The net assets represent the accumulation of surplus private and Government of Canada contributions and investment income earned thereon after interfund transfers.

restricted reserve fund for long-term investments and related investment income. This fund will not be used for operational purposes and is not available for any other purpose without approval of the board of directors.

Revenue recognition

Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amounts can be reasonably estimated and collection thereof is reasonably assured. Restricted contributions are deferred and recognized as revenue as the related expenses are incurred.

Investment income including interest, realized gains (losses) and unrealized gains (losses) is recognized as revenue when earned

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include short-term deposits with maturities of less than 90 days and are recorded at fair value.

Loans



On April 1, 2017, all loans in good standing were converted into grants. Previously, loans to artists, producers and record companies were advanced to finance costs directly associated with recordings as well as the promotion and marketing of those recordings. These loans were repaid directly from royalty proceeds of projects financed by the program. Due to the uncertainty of ultimate collectibility, loans are expensed when the monies are advanced. No loans were issued this fiscal year (2018 - \$nil). Repayment of past loans is recorded as a recovery of loans and awards (now grants) when cash is received from the recipient.

Property and equipment

Property and equipment are recorded in the capital asset fund at cost and are amortized over their estimated useful lives using the following methods and annual rates:

Computer equipment	30% - 100% declining balance
Furniture and equipment	20% declining balance
Leasehold improvements	straight-line over term of lease

Intangible assets

Intangible assets are recorded in the capital asset fund at cost less accumulated amortization and include developed computer software with a finite useful life. The Foundation has chosen to capitalize qualifying development costs in the statement of financial position. These assets are amortized on a straight-line basis over their estimated useful lives of seven years.

Impairment of long-lived assets

The Foundation tests for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value of the assets may not be recoverable. Recoverability is assessed by comparing the carrying value to the projected future net cash flows the longlived assets are expected to generate through their direct use and eventual disposition. When a test for impairment indicates the carrying value of an asset is not recoverable, an impairment loss is recognized to the extent the carrying value exceeds fair value.

Contributed services

Members of FACTOR's board of directors, members of the National Advisory Board and unpaid volunteers from the music industry donate their time without monetary compensation. Because of the difficulty of determining the fair value of the contributed services, the value of these services is not recognized in the financial statements.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with ASNPO requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Financial instruments

Short-term investments comprise guaranteed investment certificates (GICs) with maturities of less than one year. Investments comprise pooled funds.

The Foundation records cash and cash equivalents, accounts receivable, short-term investments and accounts payable and accrued liabilities at amortized cost.

The Foundation records investments in equity securities that are quoted in an active market at fair value in the statement of financial position with changes in fair value recorded in the statement of operations.

Financial assets are tested for impairment at the end of each reporting period when there are indications the assets may be impaired.

Related parties

Related party transactions are measured at the exchange amount, which is the amount of consideration established and agreed to by the related parties.

10. Interfund transfers

During the year, \$13,918 (2018 - \$19,348) was transferred to the capital asset fund from the general fund. In addition, \$3,901,574 was transferred from the investments of the restricted general fund to the unrestricted reserve fund. These transfers were approved by the board of directors.

11. Financial instruments

The Foundation's investment activities may expose it to a variety of financial risks, including credit risk, liquidity risk, interest rate risk, market risk and currency risk. The following provides an overview of the risks associated with these investments.

Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk a counterparty to a financial instrument will fail to perform its obligations. The carrying value of financial assets represents the maximum credit risk exposure. The Foundation's credit risk on investments is concentrated in a portfolio of pooled funds held entirely with one counterparty. The Foundation invests primarily in a portfolio of marketable securities and GICs and its accounts receivable are primarily due from the Government of Canada. Therefore, exposure to credit risk is not significant.

Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk FACTOR will not be able to meet its obligations as they come due. The financial obligations of FACTOR include liabilities, which are short-term in nature, and grants commitments. FACTOR has invested in marketable securities and GICs for which a secondary market exists and thus these funds are determined to be liquid. FACTOR has sufficient funds to settle its obligations. Therefore, exposure to liquidity risk is not significant.

Interest rate risk

Interest rate risk is the risk a change in interest rates will adversely affect the fair value of fixed income securities or cause fluctuations in future cash flows of a financial instrument. The Foundation's exposure to interest rate risk is concentrated in its investments in GICs and its investments in fixed income pooled funds, which comprise 60% of the Foundation's investment portfolio. The Foundation does not hold any variable rate debt.

Market risk

Market risk is the risk the future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate due to changes in market prices. The Foundation is exposed to fluctuations in the yield on its investments in Canadian and foreign equity pooled funds, which comprise 40% of the Foundation's investment portfolio.

Currency risk

Currency risk is the risk the fair value of a financial instrument will fluctuate due to changes in foreign exchange rates. The Foundation invests in equity securities that hold investments priced in currencies other than the Canadian dollar. The Foundation is therefore exposed to currency risk on its investments in foreign equity pooled funds, which comprise 30% of the Foundation's investment portfolio.

12. Related party transactions

During the year, FACTOR approved grants, in the normal course of operations, to related organizations in the amount of \$924,993 (2018 - \$96,937) and extended payments in the amount of \$463,120 (2018 - \$60,188), which are included in the statement of operations as grants. Total outstanding commitments to these parties amounted to \$461,873 as at March 31, 2019 (2018 - \$36,749), which are disclosed as commitments in note 8. The parties are related by virtue of the fact the recipients have representation on FACTOR's board of directors.

Transactions with related parties increased in 2019 due to including The Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Science (CARAS) in the related parties list. Meghan Symsyk joined the CARAS board of directors during the last fiscal year. Total amounts of approved grants, extended payments and outstanding commitments to CARAS in 2019 were \$300,000, \$150,000 and \$150,000 respectively. The level of funding CARAS received in 2019 was consistent with prior year. Additionally, in 2019 there was a one off Department of Canadian Heritage mandated initiative totalling \$87,000 run by Music Nova Scotia.
